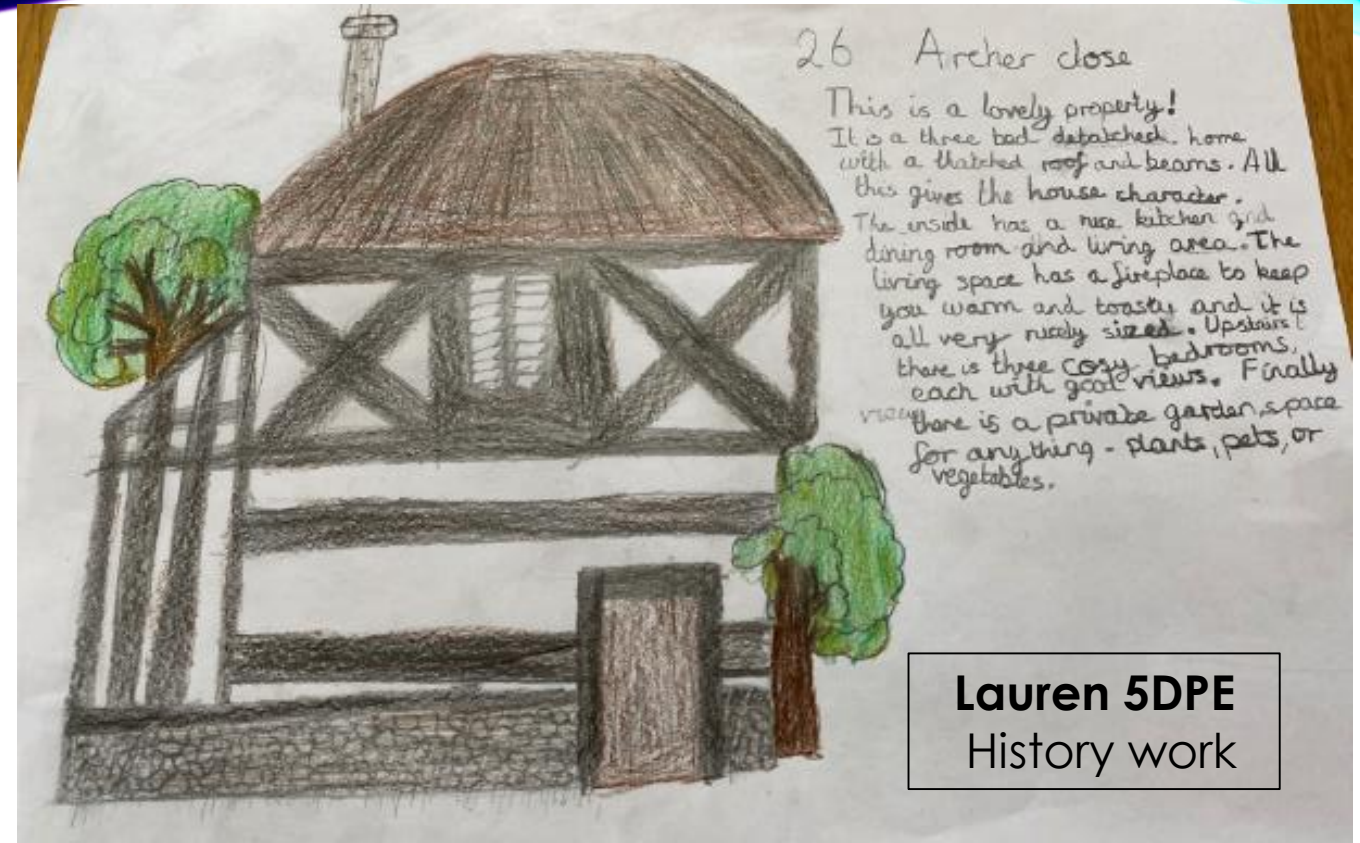




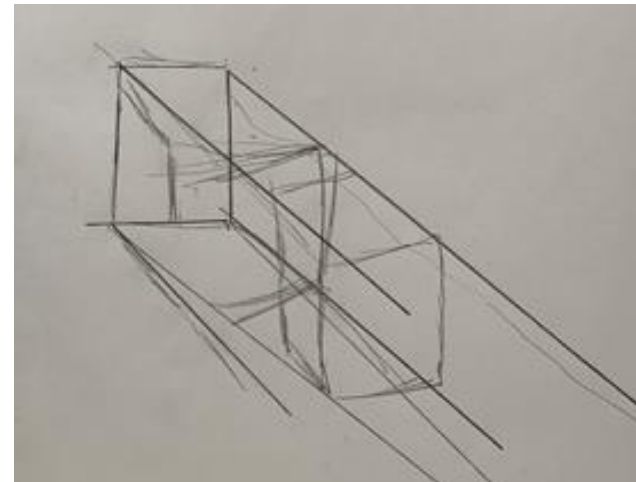

La Tour Eiffel.
It is 324 metres tall (including antennas) and weighs 10,100 tonnes.
It was the tallest structure in France until the construction of a military transmitter in the town of Salsac in 1973. The Millau Viaduct, completed in 2004, is also taller, at 343 metres.



Notre Dame.
On April 15, 2019 the spire and the oak roof collapsed after a spectacular fire that destroyed a large part of Notre Dame.
Towering at a height of 69 meters (226 feet).



La Seine.
The Seine is France's third-longest river, extending 485 miles from Dijon to the English Channel.
The Seine still supplies about half of the water used in Paris.



La Bastille.
The Bastille was originally a castle built in the late 14th century at the Porte Saint-Antoine. It was 24 meters high and surrounded by 8 round towers.



L'Arc de Triomphe.
It took 30 years to finish the Arc de Triomphe.
The Arc de Triomphe wasn't completed until 1836, 15 years after Napoleon's death.
At 164 feet high by 148 feet wide, it's the second-largest triumphal arch standing today.



Le Louvre.
9.3 million visitors per year.
The museum offers 380,000 pieces in total.
The Musée du Louvre was not originally museum. It was a fortress that was built in 1190.



Sacre Coeur.
It was already a place of worship long before its construction.
It is the second highest point of the city.
The purpose of the church was to protect the French, but also for them to be forgiven for all their sins since the French Revolution.



Les Champs Elysees.
champs-Élysées is one of the most famous and recognizable avenues in the world. It is 1.9 kilometers long and 70 meters wide.

E-SAFETY

E-safety is very important. Especially on today's social media apps and games.
