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1 AIMS

This policy aims to ensure that:

- Suitable education is arranged for pupils on roll who cannot attend school due to health needs
- Pupils, staff and parents understand what the school is responsible for when this education is being provided by the local authority

2 LEGISLATION AND GUIDANCE

This policy reflects the requirements of the [Education Act 1996](#).

This policy complies with our funding agreement and articles of association.

3 THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SCHOOL

3.1 If the school makes arrangements

Initially, the school will attempt to make arrangements to deliver suitable education for children with health needs who cannot attend school.

Alameda Middle School will have a named member of staff who is responsible for:

- Consulting with parents and children about the most appropriate arrangements
- Liaising with parents to determine the pupils 'programme of study whilst they are absent from school
- Actively monitor pupil progress
- Plan arrangements to reintegrate pupils back into school by setting a meeting and a reintegration plan, establishing any potential barriers to learning and ensuring the plan seeks to overcome these.
- Keep pupils informed about school events and encouraging communication with their peers
- Arrangements made would include sending work home, set using Google Classroom, providing communication via a teaching assistant, teachers and pastoral support officers and liaising with hospital schools

3.2 If the local authority makes arrangements

If Alameda Middle School cannot make suitable arrangements or the pupils absence from school exceeds a three week period Alameda Middle School will make a referral to Central Bedfordshire's Medical Needs Team.

The Medical needs service provide teaching and support for children and young people of statutory school age and on the roll of a school who, due to illness, require suitable alternative arrangements for their education for the period of that illness.

Teaching is provided for pupils whose education is disrupted for an initial period exceeding three weeks, due to:

- an illness or injury keeping the pupil away from school whilst recovering
- an illness or injury requiring regular hospital attendance
- a chronic condition that causes frequent absences from school
- a mental illness requiring therapeutic support

The service provides high quality teaching, mainly in the three core subjects of maths, science and English, as a way of supporting reintegration back into school.

In the main, education takes place in a pupil's home environment. However, where the pupil is able, education takes place in other buildings and may be in small groups. Pupils remain on the roll at Alameda Middle School and the medical needs teachers work in partnership with Alameda Middle School to ensure continuity and progression for the pupil, taking account of medical advice. Alameda Middle School and the medical needs team support reintegration of pupils where the medical advice supports their readiness to return to school.

In cases where the local authority makes arrangements, the school will

- Work constructively with the Medical Needs Team and relevant agencies and parents to ensure the best outcomes for the pupil
- Share information with the Medical Needs Team and relevant health services as required
- Help make sure that the provision offered to the pupil is as effective as possible and that the child can be reintegrated back into school successfully
- When reintegration is anticipated, work with the local authority to:
 - Plan for consistent provision during and after the period of education outside the school, allowing the pupil to access the same curriculum and materials that they would have used in school as far as possible
 - Enable the pupil to stay in touch with school life (e.g. through newsletters, emails, invitations to school events or internet links to lessons from their school)
 - Create individually tailored reintegration plans for each child returning to school
 - Consider whether any reasonable adjustments need to be made

4 MONITORING ARRANGEMENTS

This policy will be reviewed annually by the Deputy headteacher. At every review, it will be approved by the full governing board.

APPENDIX 1

AIMS

- To offer a tailored programme of education to assist pupils' reintegration into school after a medical illness
- To support and advise schools on skills and strategies to aid reintegration to school
- To engage with parents and carers to enable them to help their child with learning strategies while coping with a medical condition
- To liaise with and signpost to other agencies for further support

WHO IS THE SERVICE FOR?

- Pupils of statutory school age resident in Central Bedfordshire
- Pupils should be on a school roll
- Pupils who have planned absences from school for a significant period for a medical reason
- Pupils whose attendance has been affected due to a medical reason – 15 days or more
- Pupils reintegrating back into school following a period of absence due to a medical reason
- If the education being provided at home for EHE is deemed inappropriate and there is clear medical evidence to support MNET intervention a referral can be made

Eligibility Criteria

- Referrals are to be made by schools to the Medical Needs Education Team
- All referrals should include the medical referral form signed by the relevant medical practitioner – if a GP signs the form a referral should be made by them for further support for the young person
- A referral can be completed by a recognised provider in relation to a private or independent assessment
- Pupils should engage with the appropriate healthcare package and attend their healthcare appointments
- The first 3 weeks (15 days) of absence remains school's responsibility
